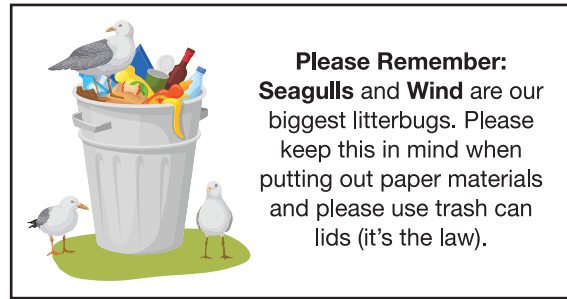
## 2024 TRASH AND RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Trucks start their route at 5:00 AM. To avoid delays, please have your trash/recycling materials placed at the curb and ready for pickup by 5:00 AM of the scheduled day. For questions call Meadowbrook Industries at **732.774.0404**.

Recycling is "Single Stream" – all bottles, cans, newspapers, cardboard, junk mail, magazines, and mixed paper can be in the same covered metal or plastic container marked with a decal or an "R" and placed at curbside at time of pickup. **DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY TYPE.**

Acceptable items:

- all glass containers
- aluminum & steel cans
- plastics marked 1, 2 or 5
- clean food containers/cereal boxes
- Newspaper/inserts
- junk mail/magazines/catalogs
- writing paper
- corrugated cardboard (waffle pattern)
- brown paper bags
- clean pizza boxes (remove greasy parts)



**\*\*\* Now you can leave caps/lids ON \*\*\***

**Please flatten cardboard boxes and do not tie paper/cardboard items with string or tape.**

**NO** ceramics; mirrors; light bulbs; stoneware; plastic wrappers; plastic buckets or bags; Styro-foam; batteries; VCR tapes; waxed cardboard or waxed containers such as milk/juice cartons and drink boxes; plastic binders; paper towels/tissues; photographs; garden hose; plastic egg cartons; straws; plastic or metal coat hangers; dishes & cookware; stickers or sheets of address labels; plates or vases; plastic 6-pack holders; drinking glasses or window glass; foam/popcorn packaging; plant trays; waxed paper; Tyvek envelopes; hardback books.

**Brush and leaves.**

Brush is tree limbs, bushes and wood branches. Bundling & tying brush is preferred; however, brush may be placed at the curb in manageable piles **no larger than 4 feet high by 4 feet long by 4 feet wide**. Limbs and tree cuttings are to be no bigger than 4" (four inches) in diameter.

Leaves are tree leaves, pine needles and pine cones. Leaves are to be bagged or canned and placed at curb. **Grass clippings, ornamental grasses and weeds are NOT recyclable; these are to be put with regular trash.**

**Please sort brush and leaves. Brush and leaves are separate pick-ups (separate days).**

DO NOT MIX ANY DEBRIS or GARBAGE WITH BRUSH OR LEAVES! Mixed items will not be picked up.



### BARBECUE PROPANE BOTTLES

Will **NOT** be picked up at the curb.

They must be taken to a propane dealer for disposal.

### OCEAN COUNTY RECYCLING

The following items can be recycled by residents at the County recycling center on Recovery Road, Manahawkin, Monday - Friday 7:30am-3:00pm: tires/charge may apply • motor oil/filters • fluorescent bulbs empty paint cans • Electronics: TV's, computers, desk printers, monitors, fax machines • rechargeable or button batteries rigid plastics (garbage cans, outdoor furniture, buckets)

### TRASH

**TRASH ENCLOSURES – TRASH CANS** - Trash and recycling enclosures shall not exceed 4 feet in height, and be no higher than 18 inches from grade on the pickup side. Trash cans exceeding 32 gallon capacity will not be picked up.

**BULK REMOVAL** – Bulk items such as furniture and mattresses must be placed at the curb for pickup on regular trash days. Carpet: 4 feet or less in length, rolled up. Any items containing metal must be scheduled with public works (see below/ bulk metal items). Two (2) bulk items per collection are permitted. JULY and AUGUST: one (1) bulk pickup day shall be designated in July and August on a regular scheduled trash collection day. The days are marked on the calendar with an "X". Regular bulk pickup will resume the week after Labor Day.

**BULK METAL ITEMS / APPLIANCES** – Please call Public Works at 609.494.6905 to schedule a pick up for appliances. Appliances include washers, dryers, refrigerators, a/c, metal items. NO PICKUPS DURING JULY AND AUGUST.

**TV'S & COMPUTERS** – must be brought by residents to Ocean County Recycling. See above. Peripherals such as mouse, keyboard, etc., are regular trash.

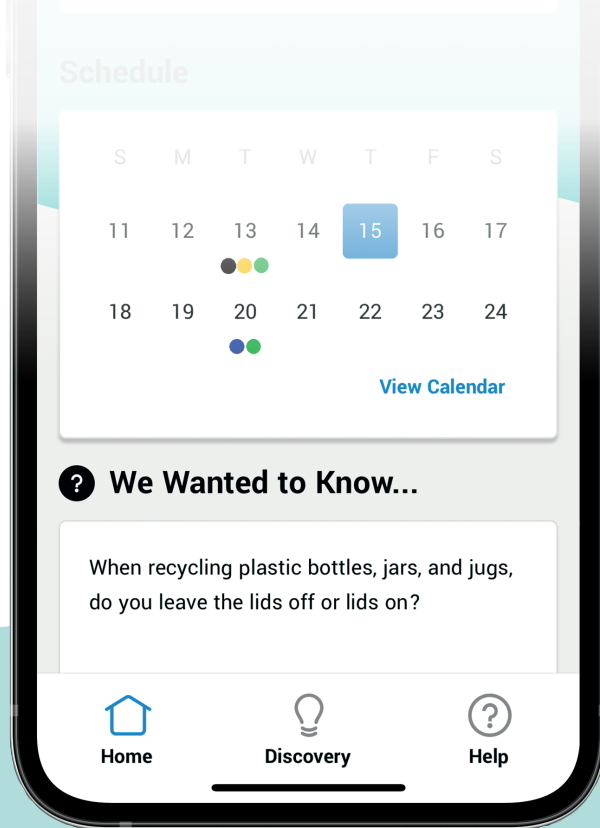
**WOOD** – Junk wood must be tied into manageable bundles, no heavier than 50 lbs., and no longer than 4 feet in length. Walkways/decking must be broken down. It will be picked up as bulk trash.

**CONSTRUCTION** – Construction debris generated by a contractor **must** be removed by the owner and/or contractor.

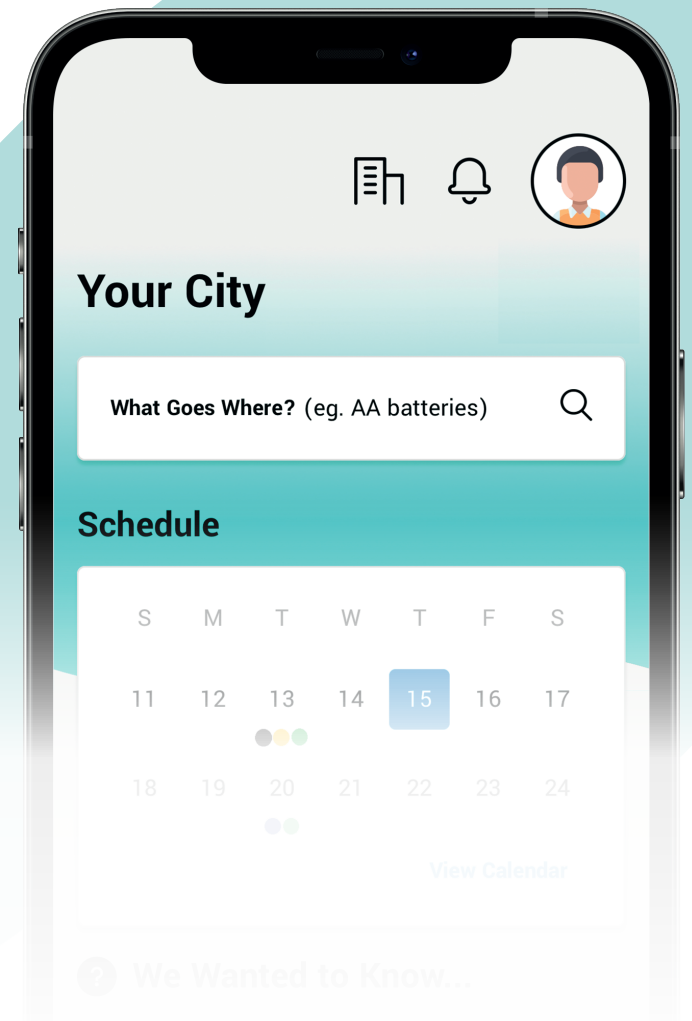

# ZONING & CONSTRUCTION



## Construction Hours

Effective 4/9/2023

### Monday through Friday

November through February - No earlier than 7:00AM  
Ending no later than 6:00PM  
March through October - No earlier than 8:00AM  
Ending no later than 6:00PM

### Saturday

Year Round - No earlier than 9:00AM  
Ending no later than 6:00PM

### Sunday

No construction work shall be permitted

### Corner Properties

Sight triangles on corner properties must be kept clean of vegetation and other visual obstructions. (Ord. 13-15.3)

### Easements

Easements must be kept clear of vegetation and obstructions the entire width of the designated easement with no overhanging branches to provide access for emergency vehicles in case of fire or medical emergency. (Ord. No. 2001-02; Ord. No. 2011-14)

### Dead Trees

Properties shall be maintained free from dead trees. Dead trees could fall on their own or be pushed over by wind, this constitutes a hazard and may create a potential threat to persons or property within the Borough. (Ord. No. 2012-05 § 1)

### Curbs/ Driveways

No driveway on a lot of 70ft with or less shall exceed 18ft. Lots exceeding 70ft at the street line are permitted one 18ft driveway or two 12ft driveways with a minimum of 20ft in between. No driveway shall be installed without the required mountable curb as detailed in our code book (Ord. No. § 19-1.10)

### Reminder

No improvement higher than twelve inches (12”), i.e., landscaping, shall be placed closer than five (5) feet from the edge of the pavement. Permitted exceptions are mailboxes, properties along easements and designated no parking streets at least 50ft in width west of the Blvd.

### Permits Needed

Please check with our zoning officer before making any improvements or additions to your property. Pools, hot tubs, pavers, fire pits, sheds, fences all need a zoning permit approved before starting work.

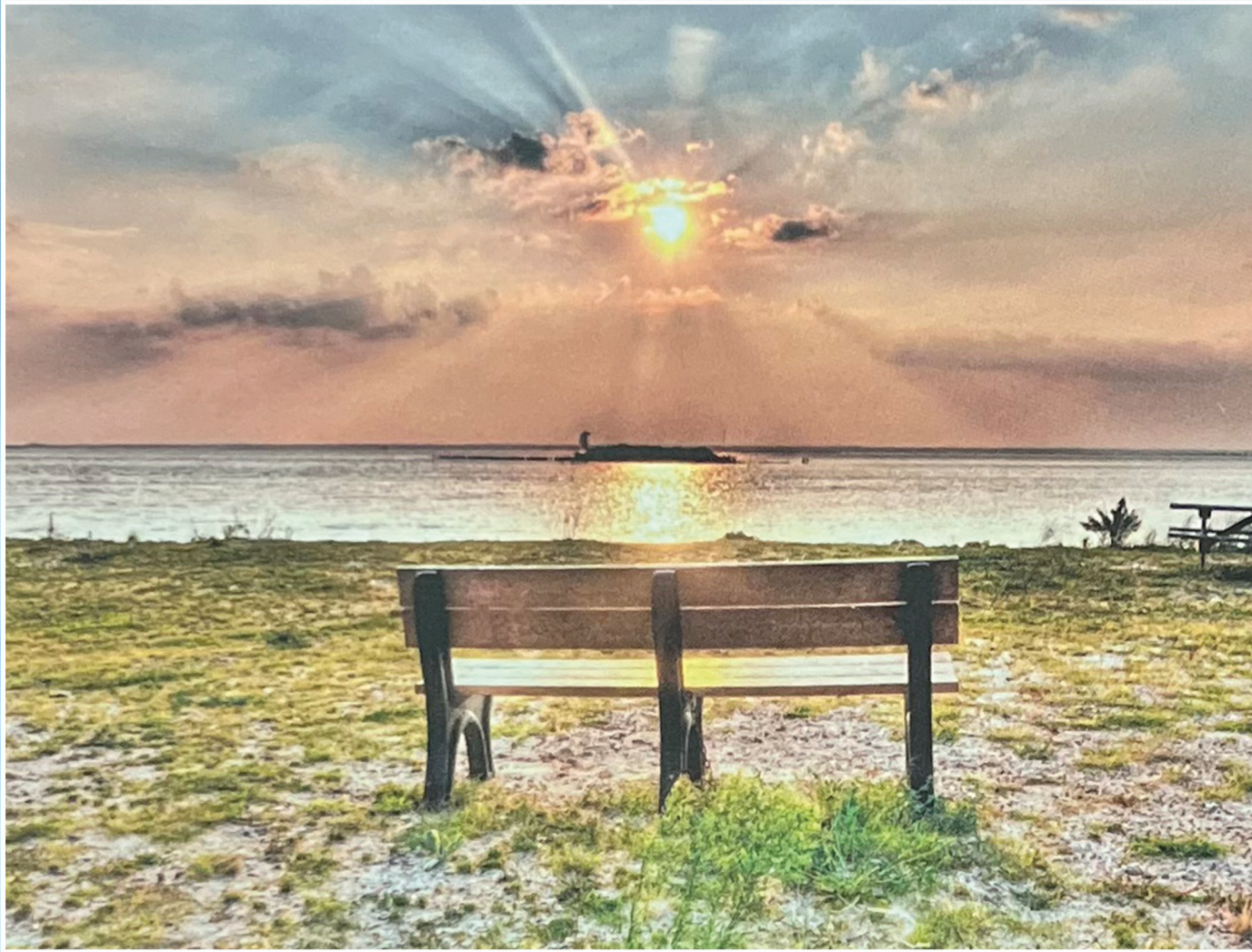

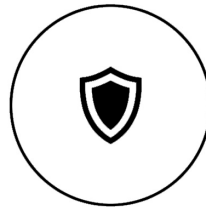

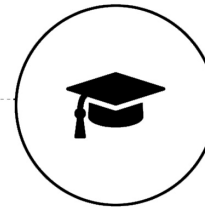

The Long Beach Island Health Department is responsible for:



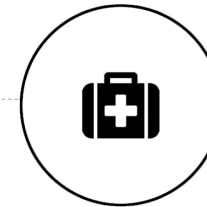
### PROTECTING YOU FROM HEALTH THREATS

The health department works to prevent disease outbreaks by monitoring water quality at the beaches and recreational facilities on Long Beach Island and making sure the restaurant food you eat is safe. It is ready to respond to any health emergency, be it bioterrorism, Zika virus or an environmental hazard.



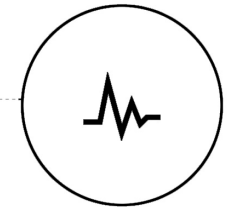
### EDUCATING YOU ABOUT HEALTH ISSUES

Long Beach Island Health Department gives you information about making healthy decisions, such as exercising, eating right, quitting smoking or simply washing your hands to keep from spreading illness. The department provides alerts and warnings to protect your health during public health emergencies.



### PROVIDING HEALTHY SOLUTIONS

The department offers preventive care to avoid disease and maintain health. Long Beach Island Health Department offers vaccines that prevent illnesses in adults such as flu, tetanus, pneumonia and shingles. 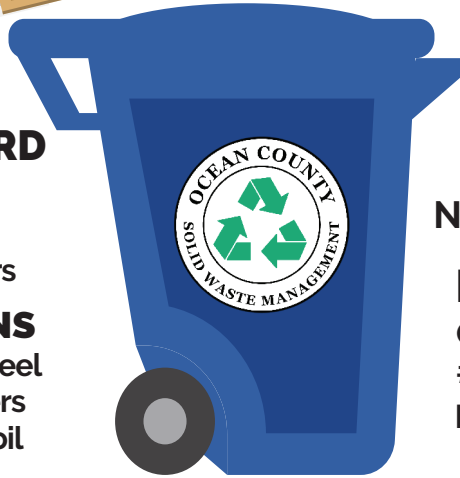

# Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

## Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

### A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



**As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.**

### Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.



Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

### Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



### Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

### Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:

- Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
- Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
- Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

### Don't feed wildlife

- Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.
- Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.



### Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.
- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.
- Participate in community cleanups.

### Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

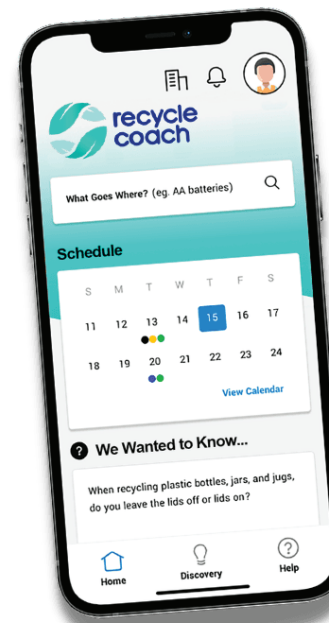

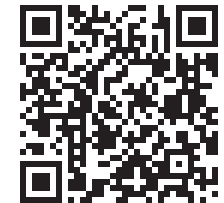

#### BEACH WHEEL CHAIRS

Harvey Cedars Beach Wheel Program helps provide access for residents and tourists who need assistance traversing on rough terrain such as the beach. The beach chairs are made from lightweight PVC tubing with oversized wheels to traverse difficult terrain.

Anyone staying at a Harvey Cedars address is eligible to reserve and use a chair at no charge.

The Beach Wheel Program is funded by donations, grants, businesses, service organizations and the Borough.

The program currently has 1 chair for children and 6 chairs for adults. The chairs are available on a weekly basis by reservation.

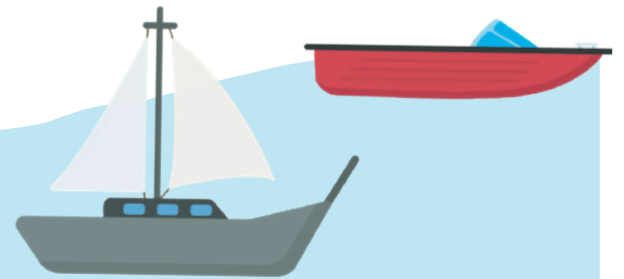
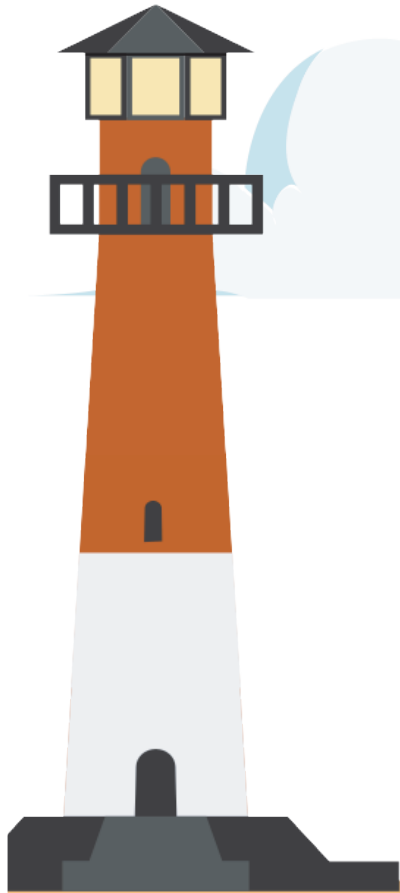
