ORDINANCE NO. 2021-08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPALITY IN PREPARING ITS 2021 BUDGET TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et. seq., provides that, in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 1.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2021 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized herein that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Harvey Cedars shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$129,242.97 and that the CY 2021 municipal budget for the Borough of Harvey Cedars be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 3 ENTITLED “POLICE REGULATIONS” AND CHAPTER 12 ENTITLED “BUILDING AND HOUSING” OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, AS IT PERTAINS TO CONSTRUCTION NOISE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS as follows:

Section 1. Section 3-2.7 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled “Noise Prohibited” is hereby supplemented and amended to add the following to the paragraph:

No person shall operate or permit the operation of any leaf blower, lawn mower, saw, drill, sander, grinder, or similar devices outdoors Mondays through Fridays before the hours of 7:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. after Labor Day through Memorial Day, or before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. from Memorial Day through Labor Day; or on any Saturday or Sunday before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. This coincides with the permissible hours of construction.

Section 2. Section 12-9.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled “Hours of Construction” is hereby amended by inserting in the first sentence after the first 4 words, the words “whether performed by a contractor or homeowner”.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 6 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED “ANIMALS” AS IT PERTAINS TO DISPOSAL OF DOG WASTE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, as follows:

Section 1. Section 6-3.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, 1975, entitled “Defecation on Property of Others, or Public Property”, paragraph c. is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows:

c. Disposition in a sanitary manner shall include taking the feces home for disposition, or wrapping the feces in a waterproof wrapping and placing it in the dog owner’s home trash can or a designated dog waste recyclable can. It shall not include burial or placement in a storm sewer.

Section 2. If any provision, section, subsection, or paragraph of this ordinance shall be declared to be unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative, in whole or in part, by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such provision, section, subsection, or paragraph shall, to the extent that it is not unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative, remain in full force and effect, and no such determination shall be deemed to invalidate the remaining provisions, subsections, or paragraphs of this ordinance.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 8 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED “TRAFFIC” AS IT PERTAINS TO PARKING TIME LIMITS

WHEREAS streets are primarily used for transportation and short-term parking, not for long-term parking; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the Board of Commissioners to set time limits for parking on the streets of the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 8 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, Section 8-3.5 entitled “Parking Time Limited on Certain Streets” is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Section 8-3. entitled “Parking Time Limited” as follows:

8-3.5 Parking Time Limited. No person shall park a vehicle in any one spot upon any of the streets or parts of streets within the Borough for longer than seven (7) consecutive days other than directly in front of the person’s own property.

Section 2. The appropriate signage shall be erected at the Borough Hall Parking area upon adoption of the within Ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED “GENERAL LICENSING” AS IT PERTAINS TO SENIOR BEACH BADGE AND PICKLEBALL COURT FEES

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, DOES ORDAIN:

- Section 1.** Section 4-3.2 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, 1975, entitled “Fees for Use of Beaches” paragraph a. is hereby amended by changing the senior seasonal rate from nine (\$9.00) to twelve (\$12.00) dollars.
- Section 2.** Section 4-8.1 of the Revised General Ordinance of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, entitled “Fees Established”, paragraph m. is hereby amended as follows:
- m. Pickleball court fee
1. Harvey Cedars non-senior beach badge required per person to play
2. A \$10.00 fee shall be collected to reserve 1 court on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays for a maximum of 2 hours
- Section 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- Section 4.** If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

9. VESSELS BEACHED – registered
 - Under 15 feet in length \$100 per season
 - Over 15 feet in length \$200 per season

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, COUNTY OF OCEAN,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY, URGING THE IMMEDIATE REPEAL OF SENATE BILL
NO. 3454 (P.L. 2021 C. 25)**

WHEREAS Public Question 1, the “Marijuana Legalization Amendment,” was on the ballot in New Jersey as a legislatively referred constitutional amendment on November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS the text of the ballot question provided as follows:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO LEGALIZE MARIJUANA

Do you approve amending the Constitution to legalize a controlled form of marijuana called “cannabis”?

Only adults at least 21 years of age could use cannabis. The State commission created to oversee the State’s medical cannabis program would also oversee the new, personal use cannabis market.

Cannabis products would be subject to the State sales tax. If authorized by the Legislature, a municipality may pass a local ordinance to charge a local tax on cannabis products.

WHEREAS Public Question 1 was approved (67.08% Yes votes and 32.92% No votes); and

WHEREAS on February 22, 2021, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law legislation legalizing and regulating cannabis use and possession for adults 21 years and older (A-21, The New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act) and decriminalizing marijuana and hashish possession (A-1897). The Governor also signed S-3454, addressing marijuana and cannabis use and possession penalties for individuals younger than 21 years old and imposing criminal penalties on law enforcement officers; and

WHEREAS Senate Bill No. 3454 was voted on, passed, and signed into law with less than one hour left before the legalization of marijuana was scheduled to become law; and

WHEREAS the legislation is treacherous to law enforcement officers because it creates a penalty of 3rd Degree Deprivation of Civil Rights if an officer uses the odor or possession of marijuana or alcoholic beverages as the reason for initiating an investigatory stop of a person. The new law states that a law enforcement officer cannot use the odor of marijuana or alcohol as reasonable articulable suspicion to initiate an investigatory stop. The new law states a minor cannot consent to be searched and that a law enforcement officer no longer has probable cause to search a minor for illegally using marijuana or alcohol. And if an officer violates a minor’s rights by using pot or alcohol as the reason for a search then the officer will be charged with the crime of deprivation of civil rights; and

WHEREAS Senate Bill No. 3454 establishes penalties of only warnings for illegal use by minors of marijuana or alcohol, but it essentially prevents an officer from even approaching a person suspected of being a minor. The smell of marijuana and its use in the presence of a law enforcement officer will no longer be grounds to search an individual. While marijuana is now legal for those 21 and older Senate Bill No. 3454 is an assault on law enforcement’s ability to enforce the law. Senate Bill No. 3454 is an attack on law enforcement officers by making law

enforcement officers the target of punishment rather than the individuals breaking the law. This language will have dangerous consequences for the public and law enforcement officers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, finds as follows:

1. Senate Bill No. 3454 was passed with little to no discussion, no public transparency, and no public debate.
2. Senate Bill No. 3454 unfairly and unreasonably imposes criminal penalties on law enforcement officers if they are found to have violated new rules dictating underage possession. The odor of cannabis or alcohol will no longer be enough to justify a search. The same holds true for “the unconcealed possession” of an alcoholic beverage, marijuana, hashish, or cannabis item, according to the bill text.
3. Senate Bill No. 3454 turns law enforcement officers into criminals. It establishes a legal set of enforcement powers, but it criminalizes the actual enforcement of those powers.
4. Senate Bill No. 3454 contradicts a prior law that banned smoking tobacco products on beaches and boardwalks, but now that law may be essentially unenforceable when it comes to smoking marijuana on beaches and boardwalks. Underage users of marijuana will now be free to smoke it anywhere, including in places the law says is illegal, because merely stopping a person to enforce the law is now illegal for police. Drug dealers will quickly learn to hide their drugs, guns and evidence of crimes on anyone under 18 years of age since merely lighting a joint as the officer approaches will put the officer in jeopardy of making an illegal search and being charged criminally.
5. Senate Bill No. 3454 goes well beyond the express terms of the ballot question and the intent of New Jersey’s voters when they approved the question.
6. Governor Murphy and the State Legislature should take urgent steps to repeal Senate Bill No. 3454 to protect our children and law enforcement officers.
7. A certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to Governor Phil Murphy, the State Legislature, Ocean County Board of Commissioners, NJ State League of Municipalities, NJ Municipal Management Association, and NJ State PBA.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SENATE BILL S-3522 CREATING A LOCAL PART OF THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM (PERS)

WHEREAS county, municipal, and other local governments have met their pension obligations as employers for more than a decade while the State of New Jersey has continued to underfund the pension systems in varying degrees since 1996 and thus creating one of the worst publicly funded retirement systems in the entire nation; and

WHEREAS despite fulfilling their fiduciary duties in meeting their pension obligations, local governments across the State will experience double digit percentage increases in total employer pension contributions in 2021 as determined in figures recently published by the Division of Pension and Benefits in the State Department of Treasury; and

WHEREAS even more alarming for local government employers is the fact that the unfunded accrued liability once again increased in 2021 to a staggering \$26.6 billion for PERS alone, causing in part, a decrease in the funded ratio for the Local Part of PERS to 65.4%, the State Part to 31.2%, and the combined rate to a disconcerting 52.2% far below the target funded ratio of 75.0%; and

WHEREAS S-3522 would divide PERS into two parts: A State Part for State employees, and a Local Part for all other employees; and

WHEREAS the legislation creates a seven-member board consisting of three labor employee representatives, three management representatives, and one determined by the Board, tasked with operating the retirement system and directing policies and investments to achieve and maintain full funding; and

WHEREAS this legislation is similar to the legislation that separated the Police and Fire Retirement System (P.L. 2018, c. 55) except for the control of investments and that management has an equal representation on the board, which was overwhelmingly supported by the legislature and signed by the Governor; and

WHEREAS S-3522 would protect local governing bodies from the State of New Jersey further directing property taxpayer dollars to subsidize its long mismanagement and underfunding of the pension systems as it would provide the new balanced board of trustees of PERS with the ability to determine or modify member benefits, direct policies and investments to achieve full funding, and serve as fiduciary of the system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Borough of Harvey Cedars does in fact hereby support S-3522, which would establish a new board of trustees for the Local Part of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) to preserve the structure and integrity of the more solvent Local Part.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution shall be forwarded to Governor Phil Murphy, Senate President Stephen M. Sweeney, Speaker of the General Assembly Craig Coughlin, the New Jersey 9th Legislative District Delegation, and the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

WHEREAS the Borough has agreed to contribution share for the 2021 calendar year with the understanding and expectation that the Transportation System is to move toward self-sufficient operation without future municipal contributions in the near future; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the Borough to continue said services and to renew the agreement with the Township of Long Beach.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey that the Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Shared Services Agreement with the Township of Long Beach for the Municipal Transportation System, a copy of which is on file with the Borough Clerk, in accordance with the provisions of law for the initial term of one year commencing May 1, 2021 and terminating April 30, 2022 with optional renewal terms as more fully defined in said Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED as follows:

1. In accordance with Section 2.02 of said agreement, the Borough of Harvey Cedars hereby designates Sunset Park, Harvey Cedars as a regular stop to pick up passengers during the operation schedule for the Transportation System.
