# HARVEY CEDARS, NJ

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the New Jersey Governor's Executive Order No. 107, the shelter in place order effective March 21, 2020, the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was hosted by the Municipal Clerk via Zoom in the Borough Hall meeting room. Mayor Oldham, Commissioner Imperiale and Commissioner Rice were in attendance from remote locations. Also in remote attendance were 6 members of the public and 4 Borough employees.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:30pm. The Mayor and Clerk asked the public to raise their hand for questions during the public portions.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance; the flag in the meeting room was shown on the screen.

The Mayor stated to the best of his knowledge all the requirements of the Sunshine Law have been met. Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on January 9, 2020 in the Beach Haven Times and the Asbury Park Press. N.J.S.A. 10:4-8(b) authorizes local units to conduct public meetings through use of streaming services and other online meeting platforms. Notice of the meeting being held remotely via Zoom was posted on the website on May 5, 2020 and published in the Beach Haven Times on April 2 and 9, 2020. The Mayor stated that public Zoom meetings will continue at least through the beginning of June, and hopes in-person public meetings will be back sooner than later.

**Motion** to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on May 1, 2020 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

The Mayor read the following ordinance by title and number and stated that proof of publication is on hand and the ordinance has been posted.

#### COMMISSIONER REPORTS -

The Mayor apologized to the residents on West 76<sup>th</sup> Street for the water interruption the other day; contractors hit something under the road that delayed the restoration of water service; better notification systems have been put in place; there will be service interruptions on West 77<sup>th</sup>, 78<sup>th</sup> and 79<sup>th</sup> Streets; those interruptions will be approximately a week apart.

The Mayor announced the cancellations of the Labor Day fireworks event, the July 4<sup>th</sup> Craft Show, all camps in July and all concerts in July. He said he was hoping to see some relaxation at some point, people will have to be socially responsible to determine what happens moving forward. The beach is open; a small storm coming this week that may cause beach erosion.

Commissioner Rice stated tax payments are coming in; there is no spike in delinquents compared to prior years.

Commissioner Imperiale reminded all the speed limits are down and traffic lights are on; already one minor traffic accident caused by going through a red light; the Lifeguard Captain is working on making sure the lifeguards are prepared for what will be a different and difficult season; same with the Beach Badge Supervisor; and of course the Chief overseeing it all.

The Mayor asked the Clerk to provide beach badge information. The Clerk announced preseason badge orders are being accepted by regular mail and at the drop box in front of Borough Hall, including Senior badges. The first distribution of badges will be in Sunset Park this coming Thursday and Friday between 10:00am and 3:00pm for all prepaid badges. The Borough is now using a new app called Viply to pay for badges; there is a small fee per badge that goes to the vendor, not the Borough.

The Mayor stated if anyone wishes to contact the Commissioners with any questions to contact the Clerk and she will pass it along.

# PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR –

The following questions were asked via chat and addressed:

1. From Amanda Ferrara: Are we allowing out of state visitors to the beaches?

The Mayor said yes, the beach is open.

A discussion about dogs on the beach was held with the Commissioners and the Chief; there were issues of dogs running loose on the beach, but this past week it was much better; the Chief said police are checking street ends throughout the day and also checking for compliance issues and so far, no issues.

2. From Carol Sziklay: I'd like to hear about the proposed wind farm.

The Mayor said Mayor Kirk Larson is more knowledgeable on this subject, but he knows the Federal government sold the rights out there, people are fighting that, some bases go into the scallop beds, the bases are huge, and the Mayor is assuming this will be in court. The Mayor's understanding is that the transmission lines will go back to the nuclear power plant in Forked River, and will be coming down south to the Ocean City area. The Mayor said he heard the ones going offshore are much bigger than the ones we see in Atlantic City. Commissioner Imperiale stated the (wind farm) company was supposed to make a presentation at the LBI Art Foundation in late April, but was cancelled and will be rescheduled as soon as it's allowed; the presentation date will be put up on the website once scheduled.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 2020-09**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 21 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS ENTITLED "PROPERTY MAINTENANCE" AS IT PERTAINS TO DEAD TREES

**WHEREAS** it is the desire of the Mayor and Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars to promote and regulate matters that benefit the health, safety and welfare of the community; and

**WHEREAS** the intent of this Ordinance is to regulate and govern the maintenance of dead trees when such trees may cause a hazard to life and or property such as through wind damage.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars as follows:

Section 1. Section 21-7 entitled "Exterior Property Areas" is hereby amended by supplementing Section 21-7.8 entitled "Trees" as follows:

**21-7.8 Trees.** Properties shall be maintained free from dead trees when such trees constitute a hazard and may create a potential threat to persons or property within the Borough.

Upon failure of the owner or agent having charge of a property to remove such tree or trees after service of a notice of violation, they shall be subject to prosecution in accordance with Section 21-5.3 and as prescribed by the authority having jurisdiction. Upon failure to comply with the notice of violation, any duly authorized employee of the jurisdiction or contractor hired by the jurisdiction shall be authorized to enter upon the property in violation and cut and destroy the tree or trees growing thereon, and the costs of such removal shall be paid by the owner or agent responsible for the property.

- Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- Section 3. If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication in accordance with law.
