HARVEY CEDARS, NJ

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:30pm. Commissioners Imperiale and Rice were present.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on January 9, 2020 in the Beach Haven Times and the Asbury Park Press.

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on July 6, 2020 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

The Mayor read the following ordinance by title and number and stated that proof of publication is on hand and the ordinance has been posted.

ORDINANCE #2020-11 SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 8 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC" AS IT PERTAINS TO TRAILERS AND RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

Commissioner Imperiale stated the issue is that people are living in trailers in Harvey Cedars, the ordinances are not clear, and this ordinance will clarify that one cannot live in a trailer. The Mayor stated it was always his understanding that one could not live or stay in trailers; there is an ordinance for no sleeping in vehicles, this is something that needed clarification.

Mr. Jim Fritz, 82nd Street, stated he thought from the last meeting this would be tabled until October. Commissioner Imperiale explained what was decided was, as with the other businesses in town, to have that business come in with an application to use that space; rather than table the ordinance until then, it will be enacted now and allow the business to come in with an application to use that space for this summer.

Robert Rue, Esq., on behalf of 7806 Condominiums, stated Mr. Appleby retained him to appear and express his full support for the ordinance, as majority owners of the property they are affected by this issue; as per the July 13th letter sent to the Board, they are 100% in favor of this ordinance and wish not to burden their property with a spot being taken up in an inappropriate fashion, they want it available for the tenants to run the business as it was planned originally in accordance with the municipal ordinances and regulations; his clients are in favor of this ordinance and want to make that very well known to the Board.

2. Wedding Ceremony – 80th Street Beach

A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Jeanne Mergenthaler to have a wedding ceremony on the 80th Street beach on Sunday, July 26, 2020 at 5:00pm. 20 people walking to beach for ceremony.

3. NSSA Surf Contests – Hudson Ave. Beach

A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Randy Townsend and the NSSA to hold small surfing competitions at Hudson Ave. beach on Sunday, July 26 and Sunday, August 2, 2020 from 8:00am to noon. 50 people expected and will comply with Covid guidelines.

4. Fishing Tournament - Beach

A motion was made by Commissioner Rice, seconded by Commissioner Imperiale, to approve the request by LBI Fishing Club to use the beach for their 74th Annual World Series of Surf Fishing Invitational Tournament on Saturday, September 26, 2020 from 6:30am to 1pm.

5. Lifeguard Tournament – Hudson Ave. Beach

A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Randy Townsend and the Beach Patrol to have the Lifeguard Tournament at the Hudson Ave. beach on August 3, 4, 5, 6, & 7 from 6pm to 8pm.

(Clerk's note: Items 3, 4 & 5 were eventually cancelled by each organization due to the pandemic and social distancing issues.)

RESOLUTION #2020-078:

MAYOR'S APPOINTMENTS TO THE LAND USE BOARD

Mayor Jonathan Oldham appointed Craig Coddington to the Harvey Cedars Land Use Board and the appointment was confirmed by Commissioners Imperiale and Rice. Attached hereto is the full resolution appointing Mr. Coddington as an Alternate Member and reappointing Kathy Sheplin as a Regular Member from an Alternate.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Carol Sziklay, Suffolk Place, requested the snow fence to be fixed at the 68th Street beach entrance, she said it is a wreck. The Mayor stated he will take a look at it.

Ms. Sziklay voiced her discontent about the pickleball rates in Harvey Cedars. She discussed with the Board the way the game is setup for play and how other towns require only a beach badge to play; it is more of a pickup and social game, people rotate in when needed; since

reservations are needed in Harvey Cedars she has been unsuccessful in finding people to play with; she said she paid for 7 weeks of time, and 2 of them have been rained out; she suggested the Mayor to visit Barnegat Light and Ship Bottom to see how active the pickleball courts are in the morning while Harvey Cedars' courts are not active; there is no need to make reservations for the courts; she said it would have been a wonderful way to meet local Harvey Cedars people but she can't because she has to sign up with 3 other people.

The Mayor stated he believes refunds are issued for rain days, and asked Commissioner Rice to take a ride to the other towns. He concluded that the fees will be revisited after this season since there were and are paid reservations already made for this season.

Ms. Sziklay commented that she does not want Chris Vernon in this town whether it involves a big or little piece of property; he is trouble.

Patrick Greber, East 80th Street, stated something must done with the parking on East 80th Street; the rental properties are the issue, they park as many cars as they can on their lot, forcing other driveways to be blocked; there is an ordinance (designating the size of driveways) but there must be a way to enforce it. The Mayor stated the problem is that 18' driveways have not been forced on people to designate; not a popular issue; need the assistance of the Taxpayers Association; if there are frequent offenders there may be something to address. Commissioner Imperiale stated he and the Police Chief will meet and look at the street. The Chief stated the hardship of enforcing the 18' is that the driveways are not clearly marked; the Chief reminded all not to be confrontational with anyone, and to call the Police to handle any parking issues.

Craig Coddington, West 80th Street, stated due to the pandemic, the new issue is that the restaurant parking lots are closed and the employees are taking up parking spaces on 80th Street. The Mayor stated that was a decision (closing parking lots) the Board made to try to help the restaurants this season; an option is to allow parking across from the fire house.

Barbara Lehman, Long Beach Blvd., stated she attempted to go to the beach at 80th Street, but could not park in the handicap spot due to the bicycles in it. She said she called the police who helped her move some of them; she attempted to use the walkway but she said it wasn't groomed, it was soft sand and in terrible condition. She asked to reconsider having the Gator for those who are handicapped, otherwise it's impossible for her and others to make it to the beach. Commissioner Imperiale stated that he, the Police Chief and Lifeguard Chief talk every week to go over the schedules and work load, and review if it is time to have the program (UTV) again; he said it will be decided this week. Ms. Lehman reaffirmed that if the paths were good it would be fine; the Mayor said that he was told they were groomed, but he will definitely take a look at it. Commissioner Imperiale reaffirmed the program will be revisited and asked Ms. Lehman to email him for a response.

Jim Fritz, 82nd Street, stated the Taxpayers' meeting is this Saturday; some of the things to be discussed will be the placement of mailboxes and the trash cans. The Mayor commented to Mr. Fritz the rest of the mats were placed on the walkovers, but Mr. Fritz responded he had not noticed.

The Board recapped what each Commissioner will do:

- the Mayor will check 68th Street dune fencing and the 80th Street handicap ramp;
- Commissioner Imperiale will look at 80th Street parking and the beach access vehicle program; and
- Commissioner Rice will look at the pickleball courts in Barnegat Light and Ship Bottom.

The Mayor stated it was nice to have the meeting in person with everyone.
