HARVEY CEDARS, NJ

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:30pm. Commissioners Imperiale and Rice were present.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on January 9, 2020 in the Beach Haven Times and the Asbury Park Press.

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on November 6, 2020 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

The Mayor read the following resolutions by title only and asked for motions to adopt after reading each title. Copies of the full resolutions are attached hereto and made a part hereof:

TOPICS OF INTEREST -

The Mayor stated the County had stopped the contractor (Boulevard paving project) due to issues at the Sisters of Charity, however Chief Burnaford stated the issues were resolved and the paving will start tomorrow morning with the northbound shoulders and slow lane first.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jeanne Mergenthaler asked for the status on the speed reduction for West 80th Street. Commissioner Imperiale stated a call was made to County Engineer John Ernst who was very receptive and is aware of the (speed) report provided by the Police but has not reviewed it yet; Mr. Ernst will look into the situation and get back to the Commissioner and/or the Chief. The Mayor said the Fire Company is also interested in putting in speed bumps but is not sure how that would work with the many boats/trailers driving to the ramp.

Ms. Mergenthaler commented about commercial use of the boat ramp on Bay Terrace; she has seen many professional boat launchers using the ramp that have not paid to use the ramp; she suggested to consider this for next season. Commissioner Imperiale asked the Chief to respond, but added first, since the issue of speeding on 80th Street had been raised, the police are monitoring speeding on the side streets more frequently. Chief Burnaford responded to Ms. Mergenthaler regarding the boat ramp stating this has been an ongoing issue for years, some of the onus is on the police department to check for permits, but the amount of traffic has become astronomical. He said he has been looking at some options, along with Hilary Fiorella, which include hiring someone to man the ramp or install a gate system similar to one in Belmar and other towns. Ms. Fiorella further explained tokens or a voucher are inserted to raise a gate to allow access to the ramp; she said she contacted the Belmar boat ramp to ask how the system works, the pitfalls, and the manufacturer; she said the Chief will be meeting with the manufacturer tomorrow to assess the ramp. Ms. Mergenthaler said a person, lifeguard or badge checker, at the opportune moment would work, a presence of any person would discourage people. Bill Merganthaler asked how much revenue the town receives from the commercial boat haulers. The Mayor stated the haulers should be paying a fee; per the Clerk, this year there was no revenue. Commissioner Imperiale stated he will be meeting with the Lifeguard Chief this week regarding expanded duties and will discuss this.

Karen Robbins (Formidoni) stated her parents own the corner lot behind the boat ramp lot and they have a deeded access through the lot to a boat slip; she asked the status of the town purchasing the lot. Commissioner Rice stated the Board received today from the Open Space Committee a letter of recommendation to purchase the lot; a title search would be needed to see exactly what the situation is and the boat slips are a consideration to be discussed. Commissioner Imperiale stated he sits on the Open Space Committee, as well as Judy (Gerkens) who is present today; the Open Space Committee makes recommendations to the

Board (of Commissioners) with suggestions on how the space should be used, then it falls on the Board to make a decision. He said Jay Madden has been wonderful with pro bono work by providing sketches and ideas of how the lot could look; the process has begun now and part of the process will be to talk to the neighbors, and he had asked Pooch to share his personal cell phone number. Judy Gerkens added that the Open Space Committee recommends not to utilize the boat slips. Commissioner Rice said he would not rent the slips, it would be burdensome and parking spots would be needed, however he suggested to leave a couple of slips open for transient boats to dock and be able to walk to restaurants, that would not take up space for parking. A discussion continued with the Board and public about auctioning the boat slips, the allowed use of property owners vs. public, the timetable of the process with public meetings, the possible use of the lot, and the funding including the Open Space Tax. Community input will be included. The Mayor asked for neighbors to give their emails to the Clerk for contact information regarding the lot.

Commissioner Rice addressed Kathy Ries, President of the Taxpayers Association, advising her of the CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) received to purchase a beach vehicle (Polaris) and beach mats; he asked if the donation of \$1,500 from the Taxpayers Association was still viable. Kathy Ries said they are revisiting and held up the check because the purchase was not yet made. Commissioner Rice confirmed the vehicle's sole purpose will be to take seniors and disabled people to and from the beach.
